Documentation of Native identity by either: (1) documentation of tribal enrollment, if a member of a federally recognized tribe in the U.S., or documentation of certification of Indian status recognized by the federal government of Canada; or (2) a statement of no more than one page in length, single spaced, outlining the applicant's or nominee's Native ancestry, which must be supported by a brief acknowledgment from a current department chair, faculty advisor, or high school teacher, for students, or a current supervisor, for cultural preservation program personnel.</p> |
