


The Canadian Printing Industries Scholarship Trust Fund

Value	The value of each annual scholarship is \$1,250.
Dead Line	Application deadline: June 30, 2003
Eligibility	<p>Moneys from the Fund are granted to students who meet all of the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • must be enrolled in or plan to be enrolled in the first year of an approved program; • must be enrolled for a minimum of two years , on a full-time basis, in a printing management or technical program (not art or design) in a post-secondary Canadian school; • must have a high school average of at least 75% if applying for a community college program, or at least 80% if applying for a university program or a university or college GPA of 3.0 or better if applying for either a college program or a university program; and must have a commitment to pursue a career in the printing industry (this could include management, estimating, pre-press, press, sales, etc.) <p>To ensure the validity of the fourth point, students must consent to, and participate in, an interview with an industry executive. Based upon the student's responses and level of enthusiasm, a final decision on scholarship qualification will be made by the Board of Trustees of the Fund. The requirement for an interview is part of the screening process for all new applicants only.</p> <p>Students must be enrolled in an approved course of study which will provide him or her with sound basic skills in preparation for a printing industry career. Any college or university offering such a full-time two, three or four-year certification program would be acceptable as an approved school. The eligibility of any particular course or institution is at the discretion of the Board of Trustees, whose decision is final. Part-time students or those enrolled in design or art courses are not eligible for scholarships from the Fund.</p>
