Value	\$35,028 per annum plus a research allowance of up to \$5,000
Dead Line	October 1, 2003
Eligibility	<p>Applications must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • demonstrate skill in research; • propose a significant and feasible program of postdoctoral research; • be Canadian citizens or be permanent residents living in Canada at the time of application; • not be under SSHRC sanction resulting from financial or research misconduct; • have earned their doctorate from a recognized university no earlier than October 1, 2000 or have completed their degree no earlier than October 1, 1997, but have had their career interrupted or delayed for the purpose of childrearing; • have finalized arrangements for affiliation with a university or a research institution; • have applied not more than twice before for a postdoctoral fellowship; • (For those who have not yet completed their PhD) have submitted their dissertation for defense by April 15, 2004. Evidence of submission must be provided by the head of the department. Non-compliance will result in the withdrawal of the award. A withdrawn or declined award is included in the calculation of the three-application limit to the program.

Doctoral Fellowship

Value	\$19,000 per annum
Dead Line	For applicants registered at a Canadian university, the university sets the deadline; for all others, November 15, 2003
Eligibility	<p>To qualify for support under this program, applicants must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be Canadian citizens or be permanent residents living in Canada at the time of application; • and not be under SSHRC sanction resulting from financial or research misconduct; • And not have already received SSHRC, NSERC or CIHR funding to undertake and/or complete a previous doctoral degree. <p>Visa students are not eligible under this program.</p> <p>Applicants need not be assured of admission to a program at the time of application.</p> <p>At the time of taking up the award, however, applicants must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • have completed either a master's degree or at least one year of doctoral study, and • be pursuing full-time studies leading to a PhD or equivalent

Value	Fulbright awards provide a fixed sum award of \$7,500 for one semester or US\$15,000 for an academic year (9 months) and include health insurance
Dead Line	Applications from eligible Canadian scholars will be accepted by The Canada-U.S. Fulbright Program in Ottawa until November 15
Eligibility	Canadian and American faculty members, post-doctoral researchers and experienced professionals who wish to lecture, conduct research or undertake a combination of both activities at an American or Canadian institution

Health Canada Community-based Research Scholarship

Value	Health Canada, awards scholarships of \$18,000 annually to full-time master's and doctoral students who apply a community-based approach to HIV/AIDS research.
Dead Line	March 31,2003
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prospective researchers who believe their work can have a significant impact on HIV/AIDS health policy or programs at the community level are eligible for Community-Based Research Scholarships. • Candidates for the master's and doctoral awards must be enrolled in a health or social sciences program and demonstrate that their research program integrates a community-based approach to HIV/AIDS research.
Application and Process	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each year, Health Canada's HIV/AIDS Division issues a call for applications for Community-Based research Scholarships. An in-depth Guide for Applicants is produced to assist with the application process. The Guide also describes the procedures and criteria for the peer review process, the conditions of eligibility that govern funding for the awards, and other useful information. • 2003 Call for Applications

Ontario Graduate Scholarship Program

Value	<p>An Ontario Graduate Scholarship is awarded for one academic year, which may consist of two or three consecutive terms. One-term awards are not granted. For 2003–2004, the value of the OGS is \$5,000 per term. Thus, you may receive \$10,000 for two consecutive terms or \$15,000 for three consecutive terms. The province of Ontario contributes two-thirds of this amount and the university provides one-third.</p> <p>Your award may begin in May 2003, September 2003, or January 2004.</p>

Eligibility	<p>You are eligible to apply for an Ontario Graduate Scholarship if you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plan to be enrolled full time in an approved graduate program leading to a master’s or doctoral degree at an Ontario university that is financially assisted by the government of Ontario (as defined by Ontario Regulation 237/90, as amended). Check with your graduate studies office or the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities to determine if your proposed program is approved; • Are a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (the “landed on” date on your permanent resident document can be no later than November 15, 2002), or have been admitted to Canada with a student visa dated no later than November 15, 2002. <p>In addition:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants entering the first or second year of graduate studies at the time of application must have an overall average of at least A–, or the equivalent, on the last 20 one-term/semester courses, or the equivalent, completed. • Applicants entering the third year or beyond of graduate studies at the time of application must have an overall average of at least A–, or the equivalent, on all graduate courses completed. <p>Students who are unable to study full time due to a disability are eligible to apply for and hold an OGS award. These students must meet all other eligibility requirements.</p> <p>You are not eligible to apply if you are a refugee claimant and do not have a student visa.</p> <p>If you have been determined to be ineligible for funding under the Ontario Student Assistance Program, have defaulted on a Canada or Ontario Student Loan or a loan made under the Ontario Venture Capital Program, or have failed to make satisfactory repayments on an Ontario Student Grant overpayment, you may be ineligible for an OGS award.</p>
Application and Process	<p>You may submit only one OGS application for the 2003–2004 academic years. The application cannot be photocopied. You do not have to be registered at an Ontario university or enrolled in a graduate program when you apply for an OGS award.</p> <p>If you are not currently registered, provide your last student number in the student number field.</p> <p>When completing the Education section of the application form, you must use the discipline names and codes listed at the back of this booklet.</p> <p>There are different application procedures</p>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. For applicants who are currently enrolled as full-time students in an Ontario university, 2. For applicants who graduated from an Ontario university at any time between November 15, 2001, and November 15, 2002, and are not currently registered, and 3. For applicants who are not currently enrolled in an Ontario university. <p><i>If you are a part-time or special student, you may use either of the application procedures identified under (1) or (3) above.</i></p>

Canadian Soroptimist Grants for Women

Value	The Soroptimist Foundation of Canada annually offers several \$7,500 grants to female graduate students in Canada to assist them with university studies, which will qualify them for careers, which will improve the quality of women's lives.
Dead Line	January 31, 2003

Eligibility	<p>To be eligible, an applicant must be:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) A female (2) A Canadian citizen or landed immigrant (3) Registered in a graduate or graduate-level or professional program of studies in an accredited Canadian university (4) Pursuing a course of studies which will lead to a career mainly of service to women (5) Intending to spend a minimum of two years in such a career in Canada (6) Intending to use the award in the academic year following receipt of it. <p>An applicant may apply more than once, and may receive a Grant in more than one year, but no more than two consecutive years. Soroptimist members are not eligible although family members may apply.</p> <p>At the time of application, you must be registered in a graduate studies program or in a professional program at a similar level (e.g. law, medicine, etc.) at an accredited Canadian university. You must provide documentation to support your registration.</p>
Application and Process	<p>The required documents are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a fully completed and signed application form • your personal statement • need of financial assistance • proof of Canadian citizenship or landed immigrant status (photocopy acceptable) • official transcripts from post-secondary educational institutions attended • three letters of reference <p>Application: http://www.soroptimistfoundation.ca/application1.pdf</p>
