Value	The CGS Master's program offers twelve-month awards, valued at \$17,500 and tenable at recognized Canadian universities, to students who intend to pursue full-time studies at the master's level in a discipline supported by SSHRC
Dead Line	June 30, 2003.
Eligibility	<p>To qualify for support under this program, you must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be a citizen or permanent resident of Canada; • not be under SSHRC sanction for financial or research misconduct; • have achieved a first-class average, as determined by your university, in each of the last two years of full-time study or equivalent; • register, by September 2003, for the first year of a master's program in the social sciences or humanities at an eligible Canadian university that includes advanced research training (as defined in Program Eligibility below)—or have completed, by September 2003, no more than 12 months of full-time study or equivalent in such a program; and • Have completed all the requirements for the bachelor's degree at the time of taking up the scholarship.
Application and Process	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ensure both you and the master's program for which you intend to register meet the requirements specified in the Eligibility section. 2. Complete the application form and the required attachments. 3. Bill Mason Memorial Scholarship Fund

Value	Annual scholarship of \$1,000 to a worthy outdoor recreational or environmental studies student at a Canadian college or university.
Dead Line	Applications for each academic year are accepted annually by the CRCA until October 15 of each year
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Canadian citizenship (provide a copy of birth certificate). • Second-year standing or higher within an outdoor recreation or environmental studies program. • Academic standing of B+ (75%) or higher (please provide a copy of your transcript when applying). • Demonstrated financial need for assistance. • Planning a career related to outdoor education or environmental studies (outline past involvement and leadership within the environmental/outdoor recreation field). • Academic content of courses taken must include environmental education (please provide a list of courses involved in or ones that have already been taken, including a course description). • Each applicant must write a brief statement of philosophy (not exceeding 600 words) regarding their beliefs in reference to the environment and outdoor education and how it pertains to the ethics of land and water. • Each applicant must write a brief (100 word maximum) one-paragraph statement describing his or her knowledge of the late Bill Mason. • Background in canoeing/kayaking is considered an asset (please provide a resume of past involvement). • By May 15 of each year, the successful applicant must report back to the CRCA on the progress made on environmental insight during the academic year (600 words maximum).
Application and Process	<p>The successful applicant will be notified by November 10 and will automatically receive a membership to the CRCA for one year. Depending on the excellence of the applications received, there may or may not be a scholarship awarded in any given year.</p> <p>Contact for Application</p>
